Increase access to MAT and reduce both the number of unmet treatment needs and opioid-related overdose.

VOALA YOR has connected with emergency departments, primary care clinics, inpatient residential rehab programs, county mental health centers, and patient care navigators.

YOR has launched partnerships with 6 programs who can receive MAT for Opioid addiction.

VOALA has witnessed higher rates of treatment retention, and a reduction of opioid use in our youth that we have supported.

Education/prevention materials

Connected each youth with prevention materials, as well as tools to use such as comprehensive teen health-oriented apps to manage mental health.
