Youth Outpatient Substance Use Program

Clinical Care

November 2019 - November 2020

- Primary Care Clinic:
 - 243 patients screened for substance use using CRAFFT
 - 376 visits addressing substance use
- Youth Outpatient Substance Use Program (YoSUP):
 - 42 unduplicated patients enrolled
 - 9 youth diagnosed with OUD (21%)
 - 7 youth graduated (in remission)
 - Hosted 10 caregiver education and support groups
 - Began implementation of Family Checkup® intervention
 - Hired 2 additional DEA X waivered clinicians





Training & Outreach

November 2019 - November 2020

- Facilitated youth-specific DEA X Waiver Trainings - 32 providers eligible to obtain waivers
- Provided lectures on Youth Addiction
 Treatment to 834 community providers
 (psychiatrists, psychologists, pediatricians, social workers)
- Provided clinical training in Youth Addiction
 Treatment to 102 UCSF professional trainees
- Added youth-specific training track to UCSF Primary Care Addiction Medicine Fellowship Program



What's Next?

- Expand embedded psychotherapy services at YoSUP
- Launch Addiction Medicine consult service at UCSF Mission Bay emergency departments and hospitals

Training & Outreach

 Launch ACGME accredited, youth-specific Addiction Medicine fellowship training program (the second in the United States)
